Treat Cats Monthly With Solensia



Solensia is the FIRST and ONLY FDA-approved treatment to control cat osteoarthritis (OA) pain.

Is Solensia a monthly injection?

Solensia is an injectable monoclonal antibody therapy administered monthly to control feline osteoarthritis (OA) pain.

Does Solensia work immediately?

Studies have shown that 77% of cat owners report seeing an improvement in signs of pain over 3 months. We recommend getting your cat a series of 3 injections, as it takes 2 doses to achieve a "steady state", but you may see improvement within a week after the first injection.

How do I know if Solensia is working?

A noticeable reduction of OA pain can be seen after a single treatment. In a 3-month study, 77% of cat owners experienced seeing improvement in signs of pain when their cats were treated monthly with Solensia.

What are the side effects of Solensia injections?

The most common side effects seen in cats treated with Solensia included vomiting, diarrhea, injection site pain, scabbing on the head and neck, dermatitis and pruritus (itchy skin). These effects were relatively mild and did not require cessation of treatment.

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION: Women who are pregnant, trying to conceive or breastfeeding should take extreme care to avoid self-injection. See full Prescribing Information. For use in cats only. Hypersensitivity reactions, including anaphylaxis, could potentially occur with self-injection. Solensia should not be used in breeding cats or in pregnant or lactating queens. Solensia should not be administered to cats with known hypersensitivity to frunevetmab. The most common adverse events reported in a clinical study were vomiting and injection site pain.
